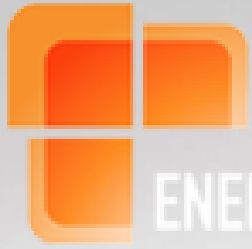

METHODOLOGY

- ✓ On behalf of Citizens for Responsible Energy Solutions, Public Opinion Strategies completed an online survey of 1,009 Republicans and Republican-leaning Independents nationwide.

The survey was conducted June 6-16, 2020 and has a national confidence interval of $\pm 3.53\%$.



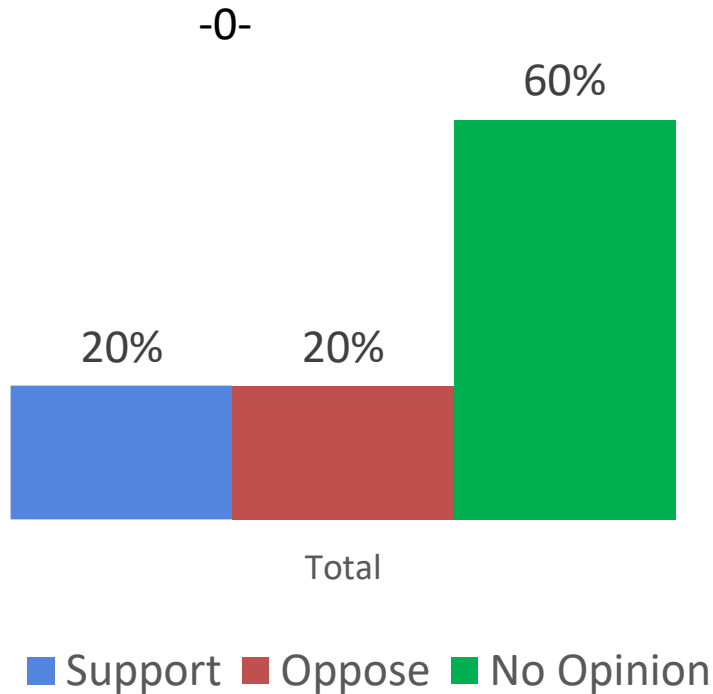

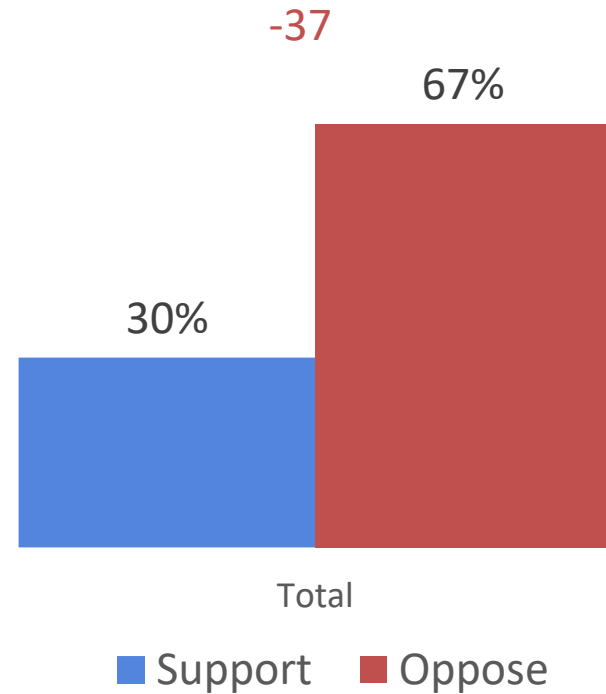
Key Findings

Don't short-hand your attack on GND; define it on your terms.

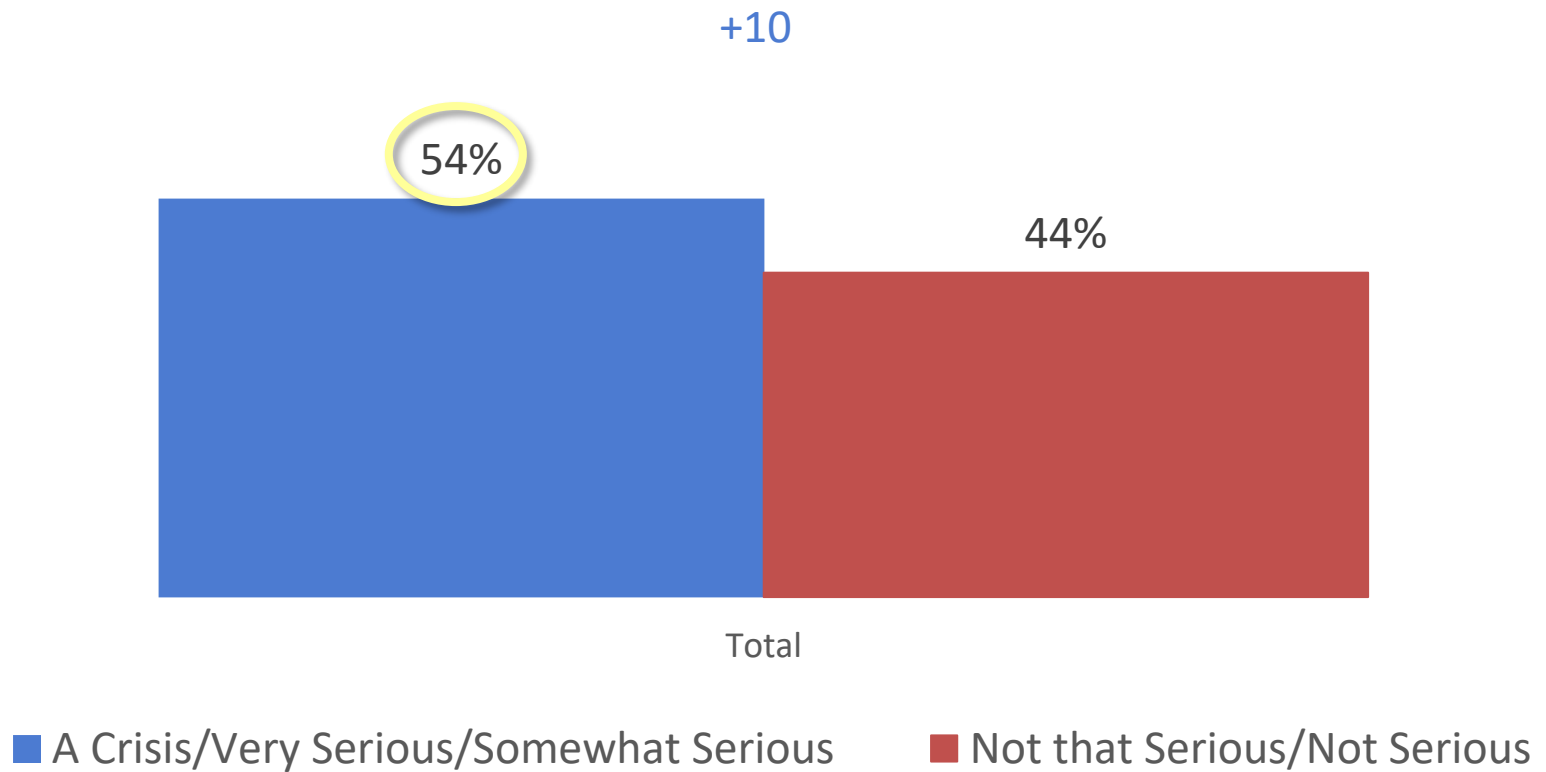

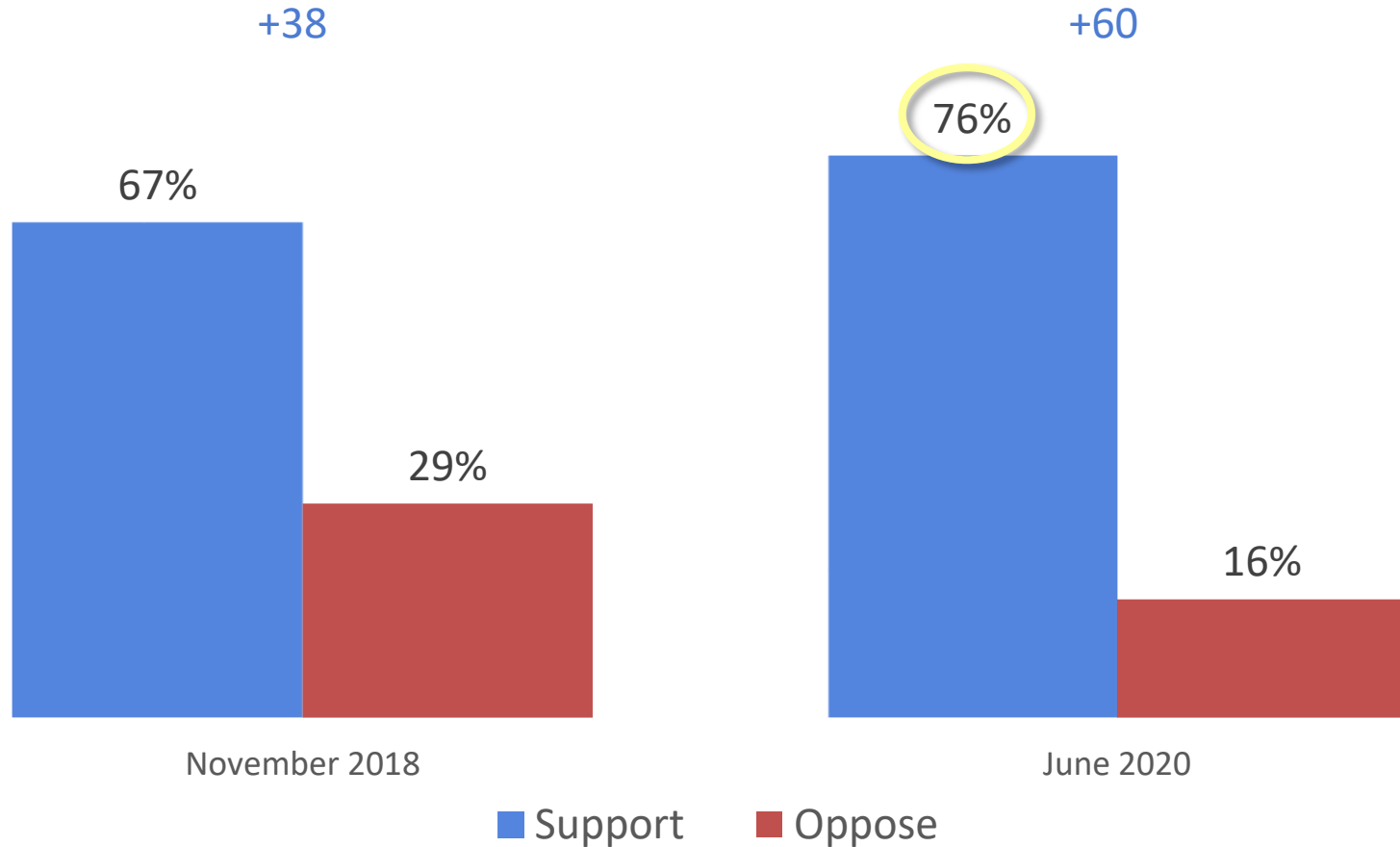
*Would you support or oppose the Green New Deal if you heard that it would do the following:
Increase federal spending by trillions of dollars.*



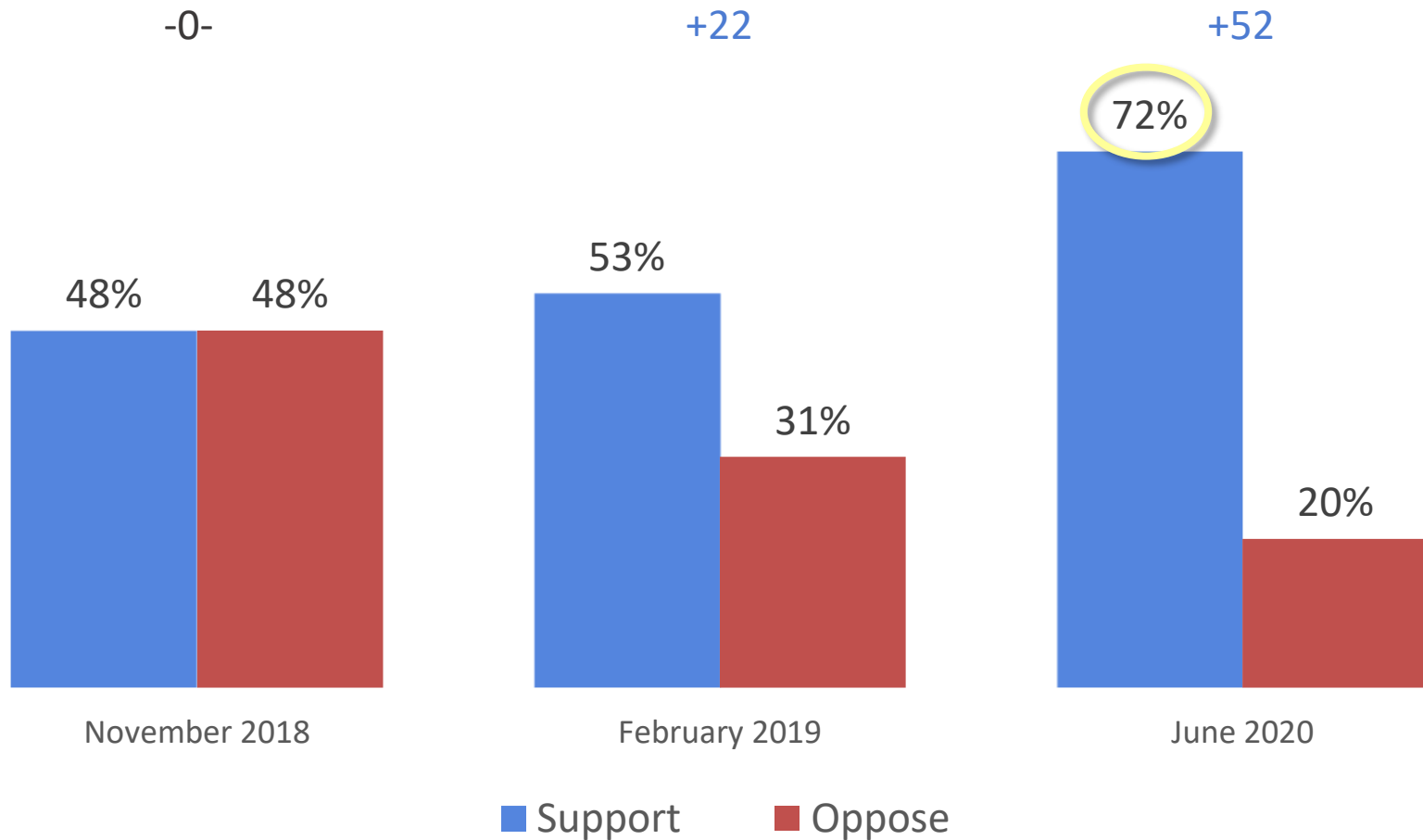
A majority of GOP'ers consider climate change to be a serious problem.



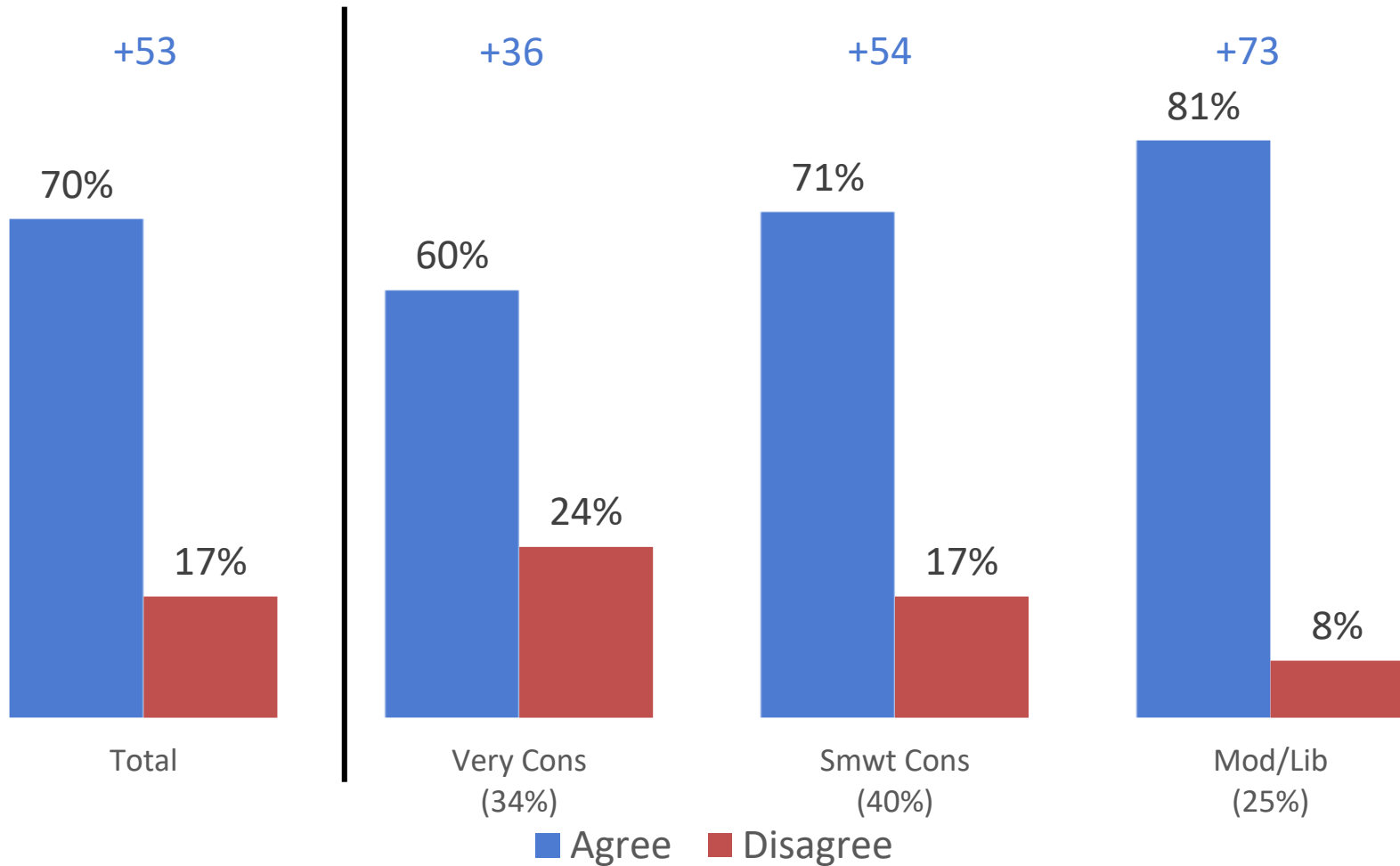
Three-quarters of Republicans support the federal government taking action to accelerate the development and use of clean energy in the US.



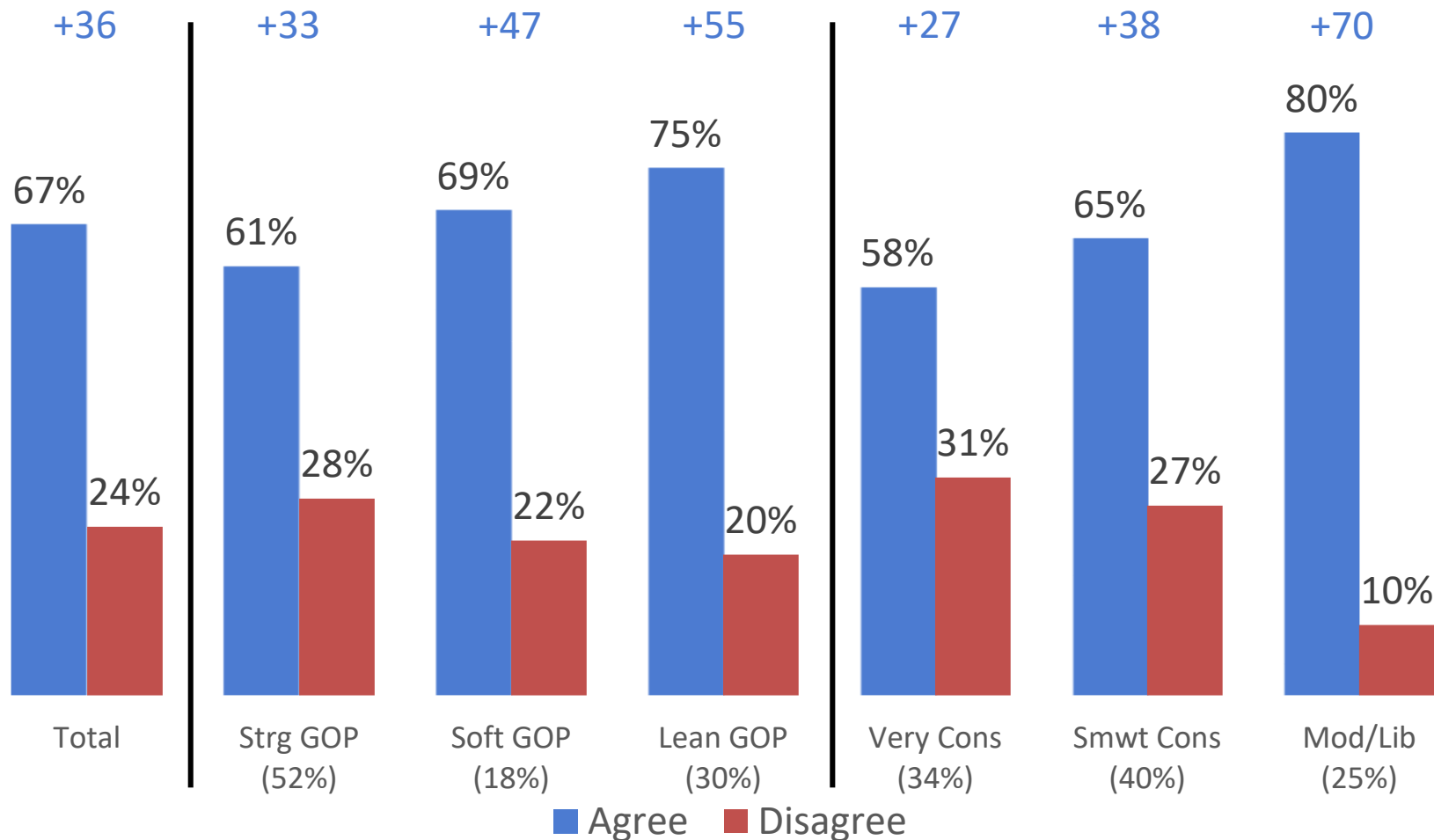
Fully 72% of Republicans support the federal government taking steps to reduce emissions of gases like carbon dioxide and methane emissions that contribute to climate change.



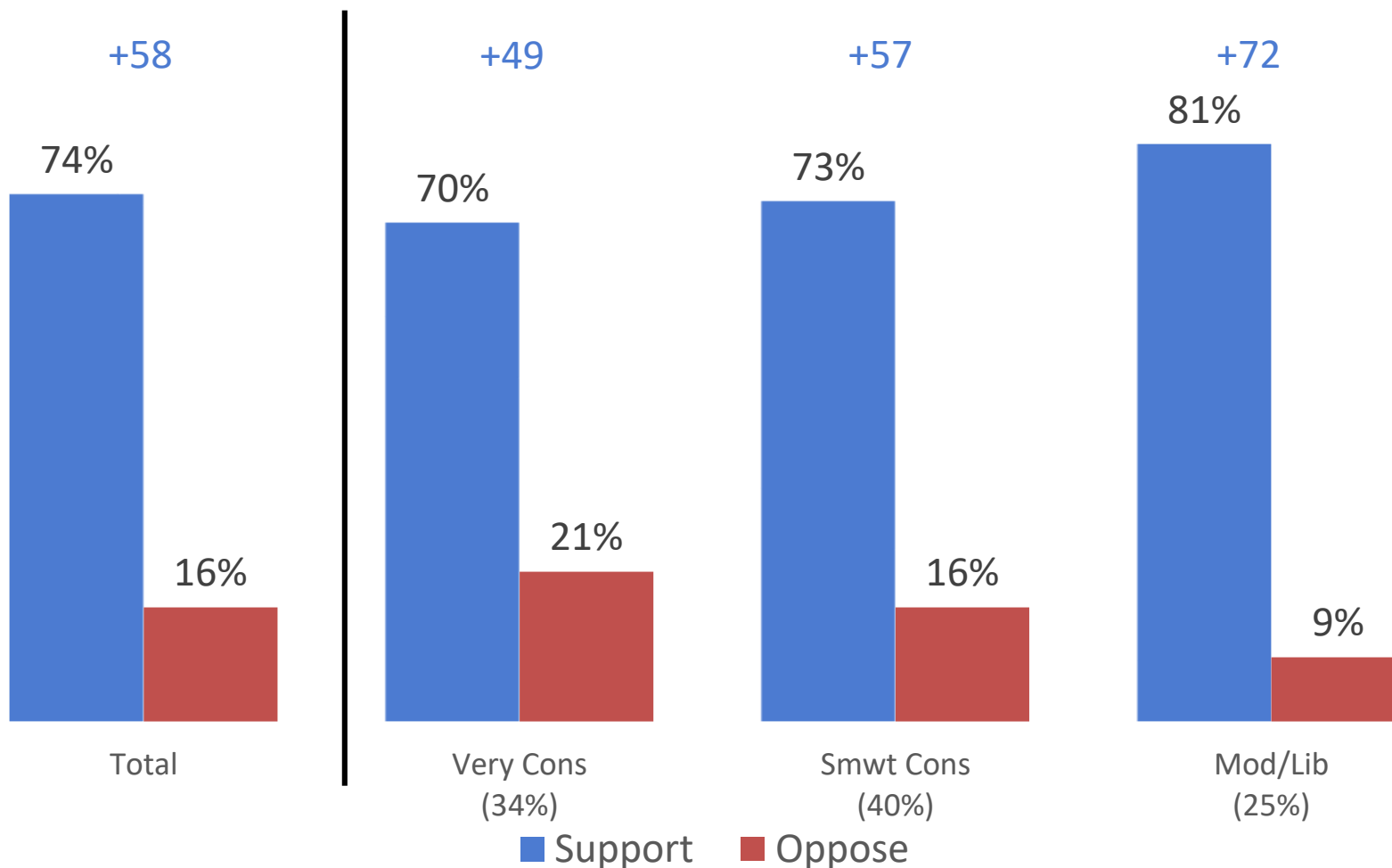
There is overwhelming agreement that accelerating the growth of clean energy in the US can help the country become a world leader for green economic development.



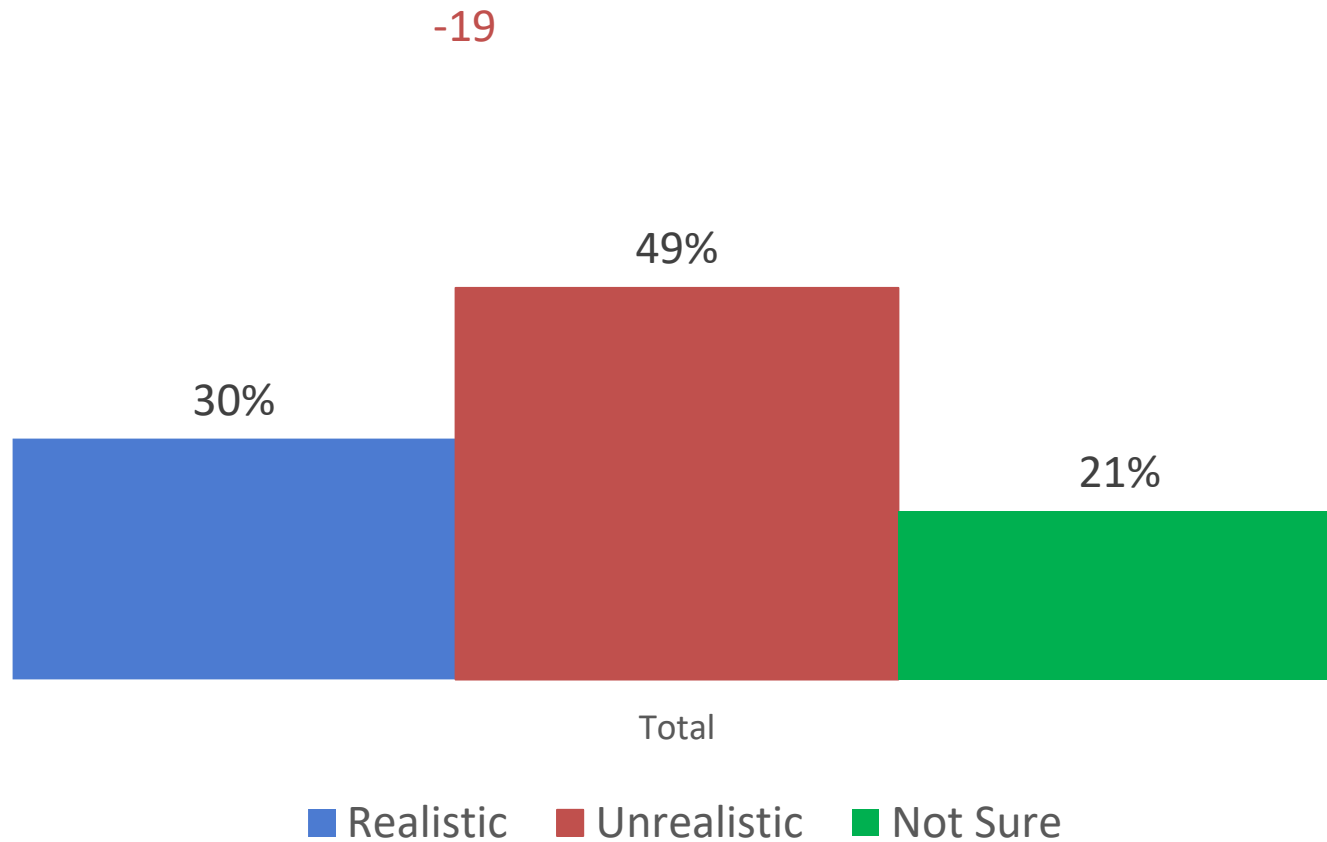
Two-thirds of Republicans agree that it is important to make investments in clean energy as part of our effort to rebuild the economy after the coronavirus shutdown.



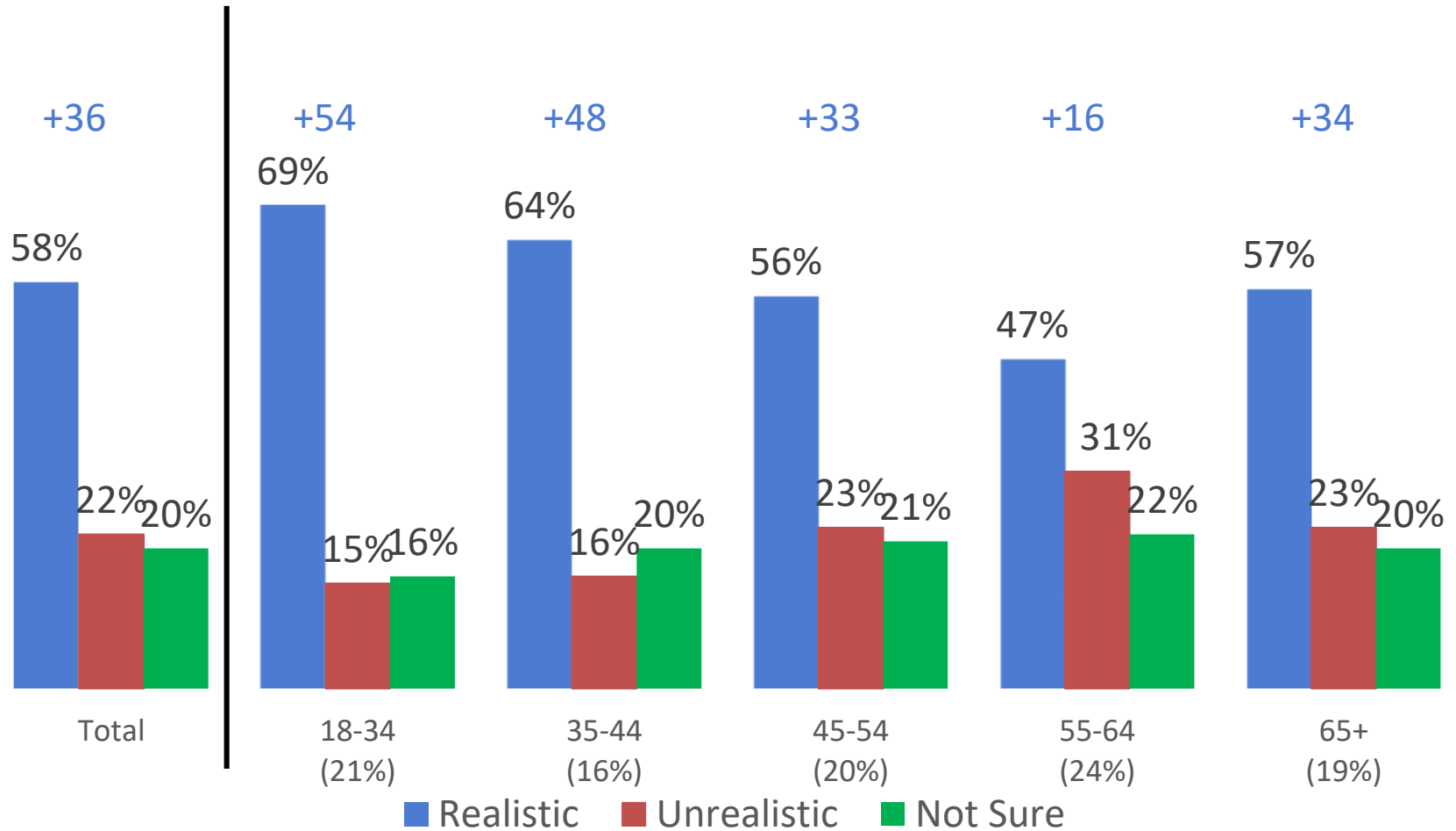
GOP voters overwhelmingly support providing financial incentives to companies to help lower the cost of capturing carbon dioxide.



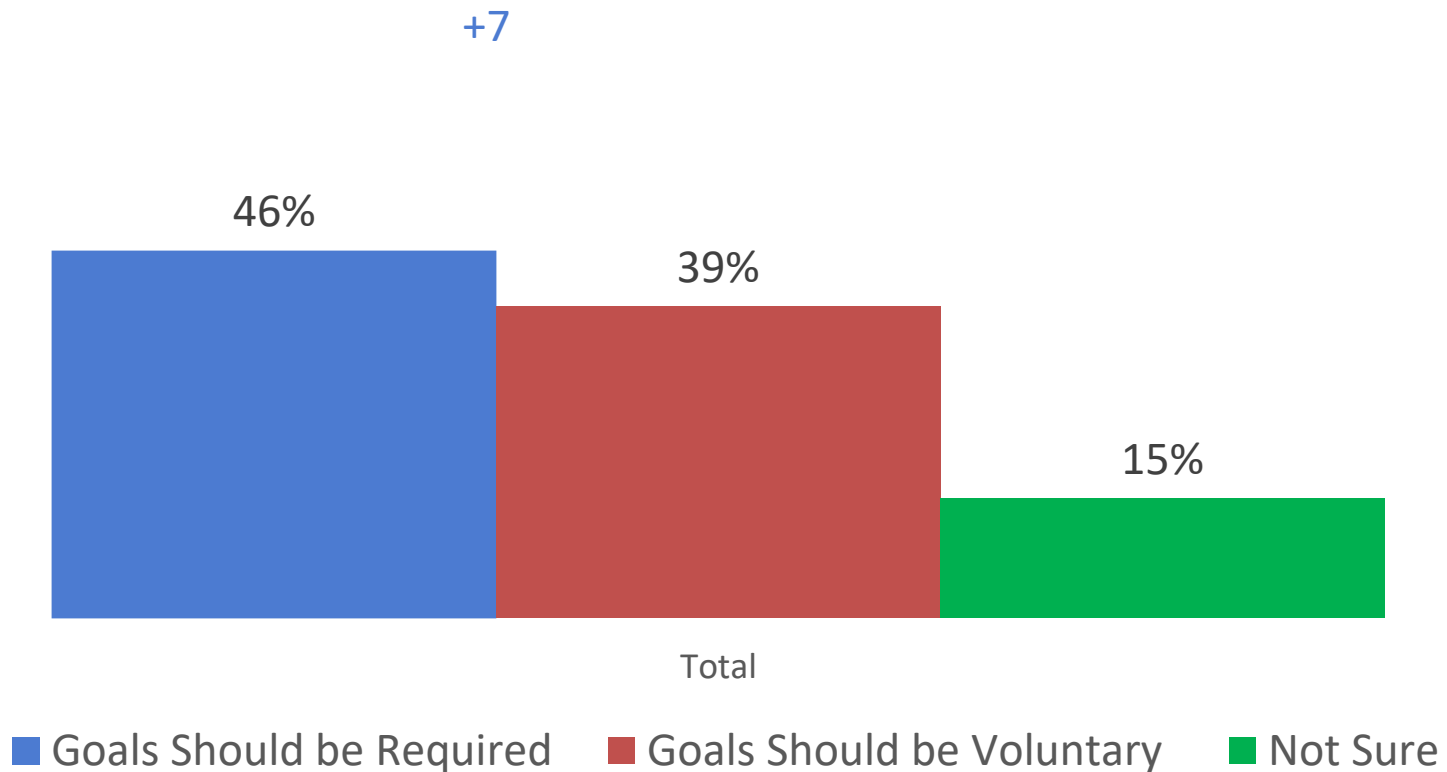
Most feel that achieving a carbon neutral economy by 2030 is an unrealistic goal.



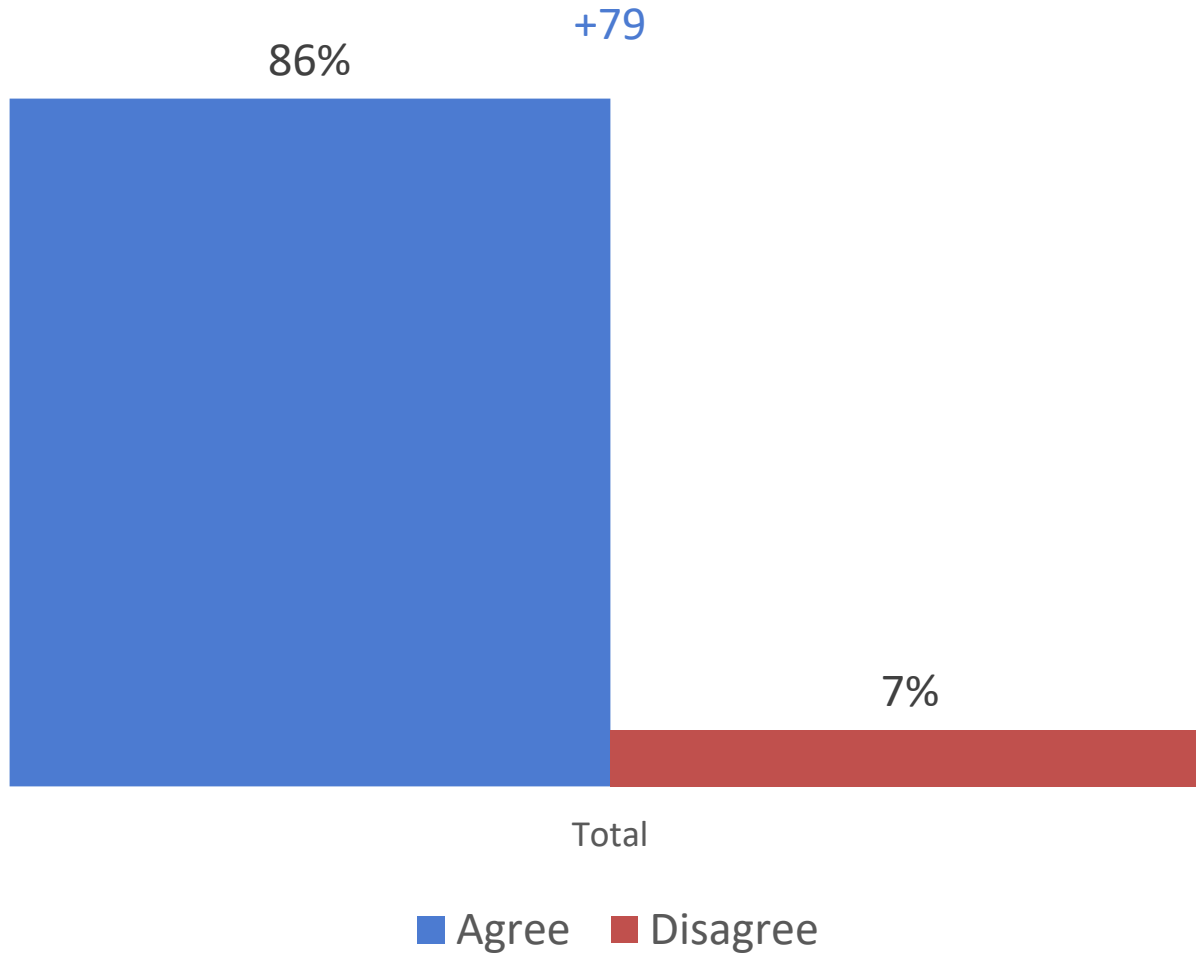
But, shifting the goal to 2050 seems more realistic to GOP voters.



Republicans believe the federal government should *require* all companies to meet the carbon-neutral goals.

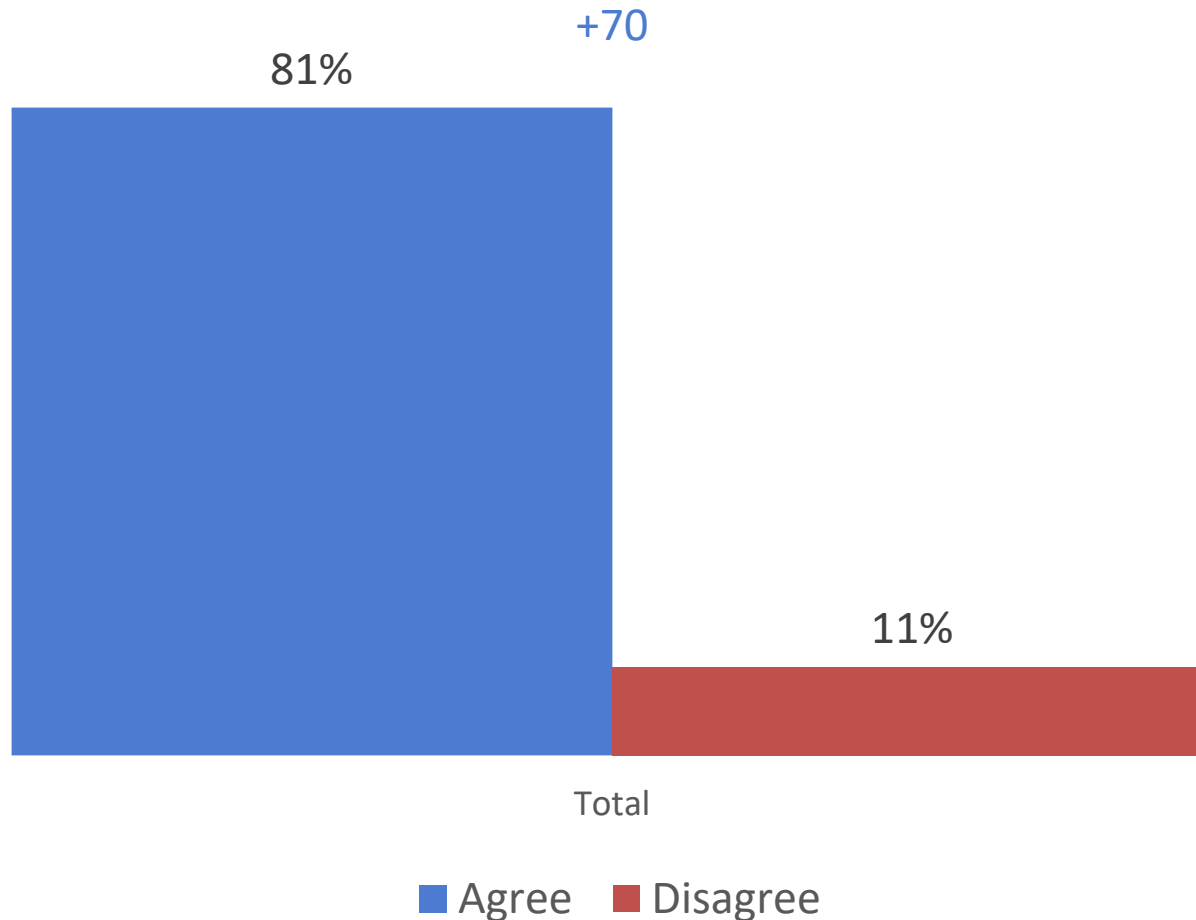


There's a consensus that the US cannot solve the climate change issue alone.

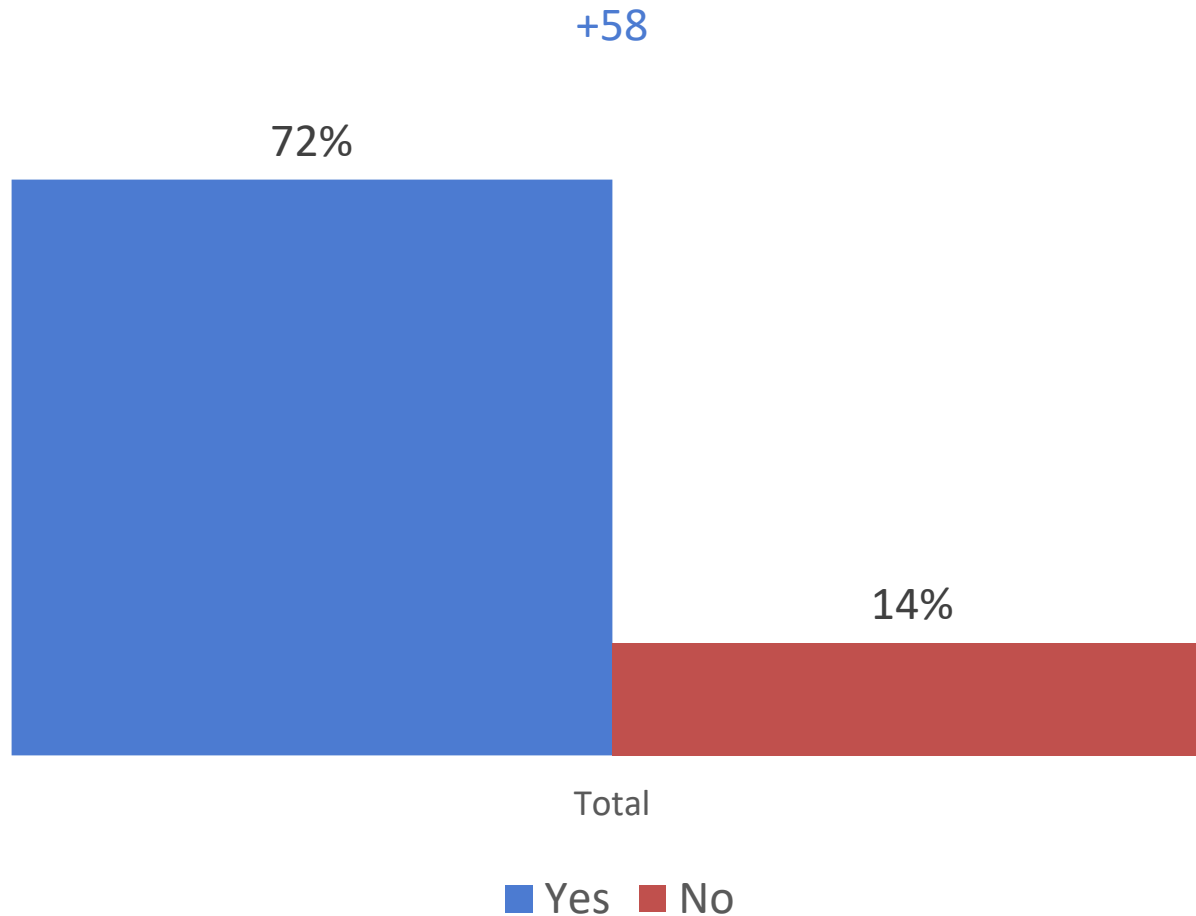
An overwhelming majority support making foreign companies disclose how much pollution was produced in making their products before they try to sell in the United States.
